

Welcome to **Oliver Twist** reading circle

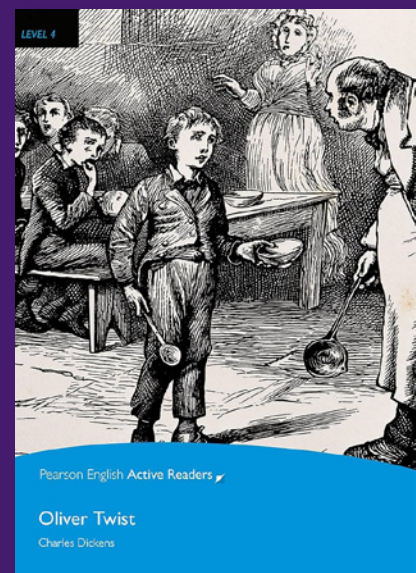
Oliver's story of injustice and resilience is as powerful today as Dickens first wrote it—reminding readers that children's rights are always worth fighting for.

Create your reading circles!

Create groups of students and ask them to choose a role from the following list:

- **location wizard**: explore London through Oliver's eyes – the workhouse, the streets, and Fagin's hideout.
- **history wizard**: present life in Victorian England and the challenges of poverty and child labor.
- **global goals wizard**: connect to No Poverty and Decent Work and Economic Growth.
- **character wizard**: describe Oliver, Fagin, Nancy, the Artful Dodger, and Mr. Brownlow.
- **film wizard**: compare the 1968 musical version to the 2005 drama film.
- **word wizard**: define "pickpocket," "workhouse," "justice," and "betrayal."
- **artistic wizard**: draw a Victorian street scene or create character profiles with timelines.



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
