Create your reading circles!

Create groups of students and ask them to choose a role from the following list:

- **location wizard**: explore Longbourn, Pemberley, and Meryton. Create a map of the main locations.
- **history wizard**: present what life was like for women in Regency England and how class affected their options.
- **global goals wizard**: connect the story to Gender Equality. How does Elizabeth Bennet's independence break social conventions?
- **character wizard**: profile the Bennet family, Mr. Darcy, and Mr. Collins. Explore their personalities and motivations.
- **film wizard**: watch and compare the 2005 and 1995 adaptations
- **word wizard**: collect words such as "prejudice," "proposal," "estate," and "esteem."
- **artistic wizard**: recreate a ball invitation or design Regency-style dresses and suits



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
